### **SCHEDULE OF RULES:**

- 1 Classes 1 to 75 open only to residents of Stanton.
- 2 Classes 76 to 95 open to children who reside in Stanton and/or attend the Primary School or Pre-School.
- 3 Garden produce & flowers to have been grown by exhibitor.
- 4 The pot plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for not less than three months.
- 5 Exhibits to be delivered to village hall between 8.30am & 9.45am on the day of the show and collected afterwards before 5.00pm.
- 6 Exhibitors must bring their own dishes or baskets; roots must be clean and in a fit state for exhibition.
- 7 No exhibitor may win more than one prize in any class.
- 8 The committee will not be responsible for any loss, damage or non-delivery.
- 9 Entries in the Cookery section may be cut, opened or tasted.
- 10 All entries under the cookery or handicraft sections must be the sole work of the exhibitor.
- 11 No props to be used to exhibit handicrafts.
- 12 Judge's decision will be final.
- 13 Entries that do not meet size/weight criteria will be disqualified.

**No more than three entries per class per entrant.**

- 1 Four potatoes, white
- 2 Four potatoes, coloured
- 3 Four pods broad beans
- 4 Four runner beans
- 5 Four pods of peas
- 6 Four pods mangetout peas
- 7 Four carrots any variety
- 8 Four onions under 250 grams/8.8ozs
- 9 Four onions 250 grams/8.8ozs & over
- 10 Four shallots
- 11 Four red beet - to be cut by Judge
- 12 Two lettuces
- 13 Three courgettes, 6-8" in size
- 14 One cucumber
- 15 One marrow
- 16 One cabbage
- 17 Four tomatoes
- 18 no category this year
- 19 Selection of vegetables
- 20 Salad selection
- 21 Selection of fruit
- 22 6 Single soft fruit - one variety
- 23 4 different varieties of fresh herbs in jam jar, one stem of each
- 24 Four hen's eggs (one to be cracked open by judge)

**CLASS: NOVELTY**

- 25 One Hosta leaf
- 26 The longest runner bean
- 27 The heaviest potato
- 28 One flower with one vegetable/pod
- 29 Strangest looking vegetable

**CLASS: PLANTS IN POTS**

**Max pot size 12 inch/300mm diameter**

- 30 One plant, foliage/non-flowering
- 31 One plant, flowering

32 One cactus or succulent

**CLASS: CUT FLOWERS**

- 33 Six dahlias
- 34 Six roses any variety or variation.
- 35 Miniature flower display, 4" max high and 4" wide
- 36 Six stems in vase of one kind of flower/shrub any variety not in schedule
- 37 Six pansies/violas any variation
- 38 One spray floribunda roses
- 39 Single rose
- 40 Flower arrangement in something unusual, max diameter 30cms
- 41 Six stems of sweet pea
- 42 Most fragrant buttonhole
- 43 Single flower of Clematis or climbing plant
- 44 Vase of mixed flowers

**CLASS: COOKERY**

- 45 Light fruit cake
- 46 Four jam or lemon curd tarts
- 47 Four shortbread biscuits
- 48 Four fruit scones, ready to serve
- 49 Four savoury scones, ready to serve
- 50 8" egg, bacon & cheese flan
- 51 Four cup cakes
- 52 Carrot cake
- 53 6oz. Victoria sponge sandwich, jam filled
- 54 Four vegan buns
- 55 Four sausage rolls, 3" long (approximately)
- 56 Handmade loaf of bread
- 57 Jar of jam, cover to be cellophane

- 67 A drawing no bigger than A3 size
- 68 A painting no bigger than A3 size
- 69 Photograph, max size A5, "Celebration"
- 70 Quilting/patchwork item
- 71 Kit construction item
- 72 A wooden craft item
- 73 Any other handicraft free hand
- 74 Item made from recycled materials
- 75 Village organisation display. Show visitors what your club or group achieves
